Just as COVID-19 has impacted our lives here in the States,
Honduras also is in a five-month quarantine. Citizens of
Honduras are only allowed to leave their homes once every two
weeks. The government uses the last digits of residents'
identification to allow them out on a designated day. On that
ONE day, all grocery shopping, banking and errands have to be
accomplished for the entire family. Recently, the Government
moved in to phase one of reopening which means that some
hardware stores and restaurants were allowed to reopen along
with the hospital, pharmacies and grocery stores. The borders
of Honduras remain closed and the only people allowed to enter
are citizens or those with legal residency. COVID-19 numbers
seem to be trending down. We are believing Honduras will
enter phase two of reopening soon!
